SUBJECT: Field Rule: Taxiway S Widebody Aircraft Procedures

The Metropolitan Airports Commission, in consideration to Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) Taxiway and Taxilane Object Free Area (OFA) clearing standards, has implemented the following rule for the movement of aircraft on Taxiway S, effective on, September 15, 2018.

- 1. Operating widebody aircraft larger than Aircraft Design Group (ADG) III (wingspans greater than 118 feet; e.g., B757, B767, B777, B747, A330, A350) on Taxiway S adjacent to Delta Building C, will require the following procedures:
 - a) The service road must be clear of all vehicles
 - b) Wingwalkers must be provided on the east side of the aircraft
- 2. Widebody aircraft can operate on Taxiway S between T2-Humphrey Ramp and the Delta Building C North Apron without restrictions, but will require the operational procedures outlined in Item 1, to access the Delta Building C South Apron.
- 3. Narrowbody aircraft, ADG III and smaller (wingspans less than 118 feet; e.g., MD90, B737, A321) can operate on Taxiway S between T2-Humphrey Ramp and the Delta Building C South Apron without restrictions.


This FIELD RULE contains provisions for aircraft and personnel safety while operating on the AOA. It is essential that each company emphasize to their maintenance employees, the need to comply with the FIELD RULE. Violations of this FIELD RULE will be enforced under MAC Ordinance No. 127.
